

Kyogle Landcare Case Study Nursery

The Issue

Fawcett's Creek, where the Kyogle Landcare nursery is situated, is part of the Kyogle Council Recreation Reserve. The nursery was originally established to provide trees for landowners and Landcare projects. As well it provides a meeting place for like-minded people.

The Solution

Kyogle Landcare has a long history in propagating local native plants. A regular group of volunteers meet every Tuesday to weed, water and maintain a wide array of plants for sale. As well the group assist in the care and maintenance of plants for dispersal to large projects such as the recent Koala plantings

The Impact

The nursery continues to grow and flourish. Plant sales comprise the main source of revenue for Kyogle Landcare. As a result, the watering system has been upgraded and a plant propagation area established to keep up with the demand for plants. As well the revenue raised allows the Fawcett's Creek regen team to upgrade and maintain their equipment. The reputation of the nursery as a reliable source of native plants continues to grow.
